## HOW TO GROW FROM A LINER

<b>MEDIA</b>	<b>Type</b>	Regular ornamental soil mix
	<b>Soil / Bark</b>	60% new screened bark plus 40% old screened bark.
	<b>Lime</b>	Pulverized dolomitic, 3.5 lbs per cubic yard
	<b>Talstar</b>	3.5 lbs per cubic yard
	<b>pH</b>	5.5 – 6.5
	<b>EC</b>	1.5 – 2.0

<b>FERTILIZER</b>	<b>Type</b>	Top dress with slow release fertilizer
	<b>App Rate</b>	Medium
	<b>Brands</b>	Harrell's 18–5–13 or Osmocote 15–9–11 or Nutricote 18–8–8

<b>FINISHING TIME</b>	<b>1 Gal</b>	Plant 3" liner in early spring. Should finish fall same year.
	<b>2 Gal</b>	Plant 3" liner early spring to finish following spring. Plant 3" liner late summer to early fall to finish the following fall.
	<b>3 Gal</b>	Plant liner in early spring and it will finish with following spring flush.

<b>CARE</b>	<b>Light</b>	Full sun to part shade
	<b>Growth Rate</b>	Medium
	<b>Water</b>	Medium
	<b>Trimming</b>	Prune in spring

## PROPAGATION

<b>Timing</b>	June or fall
<b>Type</b>	Semi-hardwood cuttings
<b>Hormone</b>	IBA 3250 plus NAA 1500
<b>Root Rate</b>	Medium

<b>SHIFTING UP</b>	<b>1 ↗ 2 Gal</b>	Shift 1 gallon in fall/winter. Finish following fall and spring.
	<b>1 ↗ 3 Gal</b>	Shift 1 gallon late summer, fall or winter should finish the following fall.

<b>PESTS &amp; DISEASE</b>	Leaf Miner, mites and nematodes; Boxwood Decline: stress can lead to fungal problems, (Volutella, Verticillium, Fusarium, Phytophthora, Paecilomyces and Macrophome), Boxwood Blight: Cylindrocladium
