# Carex Everest



## KEY FEATURES

<b>Exposure</b>	Part shade
<b>Mature Size</b>	18" H x 18" W
<b>USDA Zones</b>	Hardy in USDA zones 5-9

- » A dramatic statement plant
- » Bright, colorful foliage, year-round
- » Use as a groundcover, to edge a path or patio, or try tucking it into a living wall or window box

## HOW TO GROW FROM A LINER

<b>MEDIA</b>	<b>Type</b>	Regular ornamental soil mix
	<b>Soil / Bark</b>	60% new screened bark plus 40% old screened bark.
	<b>Lime</b>	Pulverized dolomitic, 3.5 lbs per cubic yard
	<b>Talstar</b>	3.5 lbs per cubic yard
	<b>pH</b>	5.5 - 6.5
	<b>EC</b>	1.0 - 1.5

<b>FINISHING TIME</b>	<b>1 Gal</b>	Plant 72 cell liner in fall/winter (greenhouse). Finish 12-16 weeks. OR Plant 72 cell liner in spring (shade house). Finish for fall and spring.
	<b>2 Gal</b>	Plant 72 cell liner in spring (shade house). Finish for fall and spring.
	<b>3 Gal</b>	

<b>SHIFTING UP</b>	<b>1 ↗ 2 Gal</b>	Shift 1 gal. fall/winter (greenhouse). Finish 12-16 weeks
	<b>1 ↗ 3 Gal</b>	Shift 1 gal. fall/winter (greenhouse). Finish 16-18weeks

<b>FERTILIZER</b>	<b>Type</b>	Top dress with slow release fertilizer
	<b>App Rate</b>	Medium
	<b>Brands</b>	Harrell's 18-5-13 or Osmocote 15-9-11 or Nutricote 18-8-8

<b>CARE</b>	<b>Light</b>	Part shade
	<b>Growth Rate</b>	Fast
	<b>Water</b>	Medium
	<b>Trimming</b>	No pruning needed

## PROPAGATION

<b>Timing</b>	Spring or fall; avoid heat of the summer.
<b>Type</b>	Division
<b>Hormone</b>	IBA 1000 (optional)
<b>Root Rate</b>	Medium

<b>PESTS &amp; DISEASE</b>	Aphids, fungal diseases if kept too wet or poor air circulation.
